Who is Verve College?

Verve College was founded and incorporated in 1997 in the State of Illinois. The school received approval from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide a formal educational program in 1999. PN Program

Verve College offers full time practical nursing program which can be completed in approximately 14-15 months. After successful completion of the practical nursing program with a minimum grade of "B", students must take ATI comprehensive Predictor Exam & pass it with a minimum of 94% Probability or higher in order to become eligible to sit for NCLEX-PN state licensure exam.
